This week at S Mary's and S Saviour's

Welcome to S Mary's and S Saviour's - Lockdown continues:

We continue to be in a national lockdown, and so we welcome both those who are here in person and those who are worshipping at home on line. Please continue to observe the necessary precautions – sanitise hands on entry and exit, observe social distancing, and all those who are not directly involved in the liturgy need to observe the wearing of face masks.

Congregational singing is still not permitted:

However as usual Fr Yenda will sing the Ordinary of the Mass, and the organist will make the sung responses. There is also a music sheet for the Ordinary Form provided for the congregation to follow.

Holy Communion:

We are at the moment recommended to receive Holy Communion into the hands. That means that you must prepare to do so by moving the mask (if you are wearing one) before you take the Host, so that you can receive it straight away. It should also be into your hands, and not be placed onto gloves of any sort. Neither the Priest nor the Communicant say anything. I hope that we shall soon reach the stage when these rules can be relaxed and we can return to a more reverent custom.

On line Masses:

Mass will be live streamed daily this week from S Mary's and I also hope people will come in person. When restrictions eventually come to an end, the Sunday Mass will need to be in person, but weekdays will still be live-streamed for the time being; Please come to Mass on Sundays at least in person if you possibly can!

Additional Masses 1st Sunday of each month:

As from August 1st there will be an additional Mass on the first Sunday of each month. I am aware that there are a number of people who do now struggle with the 9:15 morning slot at S Mary's. Therefore there will be an additional Mass at 4pm on the 1st Sunday of each month, which when possible will be a High Mass in the Extraordinary Form.

> Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ.

Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determining that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved in whom, through his blood, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins.

Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us in all wisdom and insight.

He has let us know the mystery of his purpose, the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth. <

And it is in him that we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory, the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came. Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you too have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.
